Parking

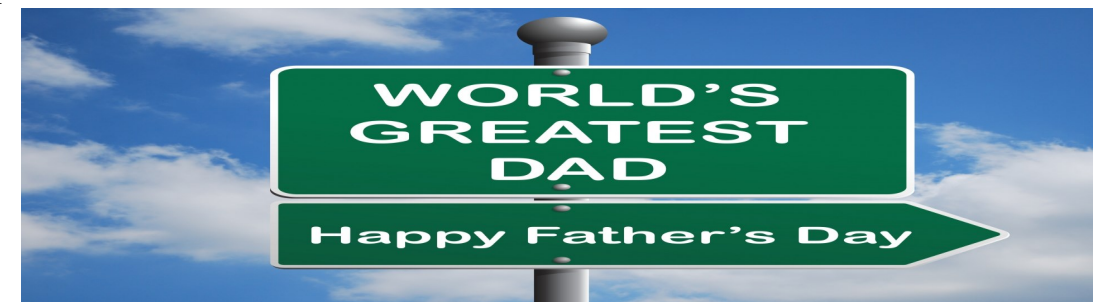
