#### **Social Skills Term 1 Reports**

In Week 10, students will bring home the first report of the year. This report will inform you of their overall social progress so far. It is a snap shot report. Please note, this is not an academic report. The purpose of the report is to inform you of the social skills and work habits displayed by your child/ren so far this year. This report provides a good opportunity to open conversations with your child/ren and set ongoing expectations for the remainder of the year. At the bottom of the report is a section where teachers indicate if a follow up interview is necessary, please carefully check this section of the report.

#### Harmony Day and Celebrations Parade

On Tuesday 30 March, Smithfield PS will celebrate Harmony Day and conduct the annual Celebrations Parade. We are excited that parents are allowed onsite to join in this event. #### **Driving Safely in School Zones**

Local police, the council and our local member of parliament have recently been informed, by concerned citizens, of the unsafe driving observed within Smithfield PS school zones. These authorities are looking to put measures in place to improve the use of the school zones. Parents and carers risk expensive fines and demerit points when parking in no parking zones, doing U-turns across double yellow lines and not waiting until the crossing is clear before driving over it. I implore all community members to do the right thing. It may take you a few extra minutes to follow the rules, but it means you are helping to keep our students safe.

#### **Importance of a Good Night Sleep**

Too often students tell me they were up past 8:30pm playing PlayStation or on another device. Research shows it is imperative that children get 8-10 hours of sleep each night. Without this, their ability to concentrate and learn is greatly diminished. There are times when this lack of sleep also leads to inappropriate behaviour through reduced tolerance and resilience. I urge all parents to ensure their child/ren receive sufficient sleep to maximise their learning. Start with a sleep supportive evening routine where devices are turned off at least 30 minutes before bed. Encourage reading in bed before lights out and reward compliance with bedtime routines. You will be surprised the difference it makes.
